Beach clean-up drives at Adyar, Besant Nagar, Marina, and Neelankarai beaches (June 4, 21, 25; September 15; October 11, 2025) mobilized around 200 students each, fostering environmental awareness. Highlights included International Yoga Day (June 20, 2025) with 200 students, NSS Orientation (July 11, 2025) for 150 first-years, Tree Plantation Drive (July 25, 2025) with 50 volunteers, and faculty yoga (August 4, 2025) for 100. Anti-drug pledges (August 11, 2025) reached 500, while blood donation (August 21, 2025), stem cell (August 26), and organ donation awareness (August 28) each benefited 150. Other events featured "The Great Tamil Dream" (August 20), NSS functionary

interactions (August 29), campus cleaning (September 15), blood tests (October 23), District Padyatra (November 22), a digital media addiction workshop (December 1), Voters' Day pledges (January 23-25, 2026), cancer awareness (February 4), and tea adulteration education (February 16).

The NSS Special Camp (February 20-26, 2026) at Dr. MGR Janaki Matriculation School, themed “Youth and Women as Catalysts for Sustainable Education, Health, and Community Growth,” was a holistic triumph. It encompassed inaugurations, Swachhta Pakhwada cleanings, CPR training, food adulteration awareness, rallies on no-plastic and e-waste, disaster management, medical camps, cyber safety, street plays on HIV and drugs, yoga, self-defense, menstrual health, women empowerment, cancer sessions, digital banking, and tree plantation. Culminating in mental health counseling and a valedictory, these efforts built socially responsible citizens, advancing sustainability and community empowerment.

The Red Ribbon Club (RRC) of Dr. MGR Janaki College exemplifies student-led commitment to public health awareness and social responsibility throughout this academic year. Kicking off with the Installation Ceremony on August 29, 2025, addressed by Mr. S.K. Satish Kumar from YRG CARE, Chennai, the event educated students on HIV/AIDS prevention and installed office bearers, igniting a year of impactful activities.

Environmental stewardship shone through the Beach Cleaning Drive at Besant Nagar Beach on June 4, 2025, organized by the National Green Tribunal, where students collected and segregated waste to champion plastic-free shores. Complementing this, the Drug-Free Tamil Nadu Awareness Programme on August 12 featured a video and pledge, fostering a commitment to healthy lifestyles. That day also saw participation in TANSACS's State-Level Online Quiz on HIV/AIDS.

Health-focused sessions proliferated: DATRI's stem cell donation awareness on August 26 prompted cheek swab volunteering; Mohan Foundation's organ donation talk on September 25 inspired pledges; and anti-rabies (September 26), AIDS (December 1), cancer (March 3), and World Kidney Day (March 10, 2026) programs debunked myths

and promoted prevention. Outreach efforts extended to schools, covering nutrition, clean environments (September 4), rabies, and more (January 23). The CPR and road safety session on February 16 incorporated VR training for practical skills.

These initiatives not only enhanced knowledge but empowered students as change agents, building a healthier, responsible community.

The Youth Red Cross (YRC) organized activities for the academic year 2025–2026, commenced with the Orientation Programme on September 04, 2025, where 300 students were introduced to the history, principles, and humanitarian services of the Red Cross and motivated to volunteer. This was followed by the YRC Pledge on October 07, 2025, where 500 students took an oath promoting social responsibility and ethical conduct.

International Peace Day was observed on October 8 & 11, 2025, through virtual sessions with 20 students discussing global harmony and peace-building initiatives. Health awareness programmes included the Health and Hygiene Programme on January 30 & 31, 2026, reaching over 1000 students, the Chikungunya Awareness Programme on February 05 & 06, 2026, and the Bird Flu Awareness Programme on February 12 & 13, 2026, focusing on disease prevention and safety measures. A CPR Programme on February 16, 2026, trained 150 students in emergency life-saving skills. The Awareness Programme on Social and Civic Responsibility on February 19 & 20, 2026, encouraged responsible citizenship. On February 21, 2026, outreach activities at Virugambakkam included Road Safety awareness, Women Safety initiatives promoting legal rights and emergency support, and the No Plastics Environment campaign advocating sustainable living. These programmes collectively strengthened student participation in community service and social responsibility.

The Rotaract Club of Dr. MGR Janaki College of Arts and Science for Women, Chennai, embodied its motto "Service Above Self" throughout the academic year. Actively engaging students in leadership, community service, and professional development, the club fostered social responsibility, teamwork, and personal growth while making tangible contributions to society.

The year launched with "Revival" installation ceremony on July 24, 2025, inducting new office bearers and 41 members. This event set a strong foundation, highlighting seamless leadership transitions and the power of service.

Key initiatives showcased the club's versatility. "Eat, Meet, Repeat" on January 8, 2026, united 28 members through shared meals, promoting bonding and kindness. Pongal Thiruvizha on January 11 brought cultural joy to a blind orphanage, with 28 participants celebrating traditions, games, and unity among residents. On February 1 food was distributed to the needy and homeless. 28 volunteers participated in this event titled 'Anbin Unavu'. On February 14, "Valor" honored Pulwama attack martyrs via speeches, candles, and awareness, while "Love" at Marina Beach spread compassion. "Tech Trek" (February 15–16) exposed students to technical innovation at Technet Soft System, and "Spark the Future" on February 24, partnering with NSS, motivated 50 students toward career confidence with 5 facilitators.

With 25–40 members averaging per event across club service, community outreach, and professional growth, participation remained robust. Outcomes included bolstered leadership, heightened social awareness, cultural preservation, and skill-building.

In conclusion, the Rotaract Club's diverse projects advanced student development and community welfare, nurturing proactive citizens committed to fellowship and service.

STUDENTS WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

Hearing impaired students have been enrolled this year too. All special students are seamlessly integrated into the regular academic stream, attending classes alongside their peers to foster inclusivity and holistic learning. Students undergo a comprehensive orientation program that familiarizes them with the college infrastructure, academic courses, and the myriad facilities available for their intellectual and extracurricular development. This orientation is conducted a week prior to the general orientation program for other first-year students. Youth for Jobs has imparted advanced training in computer programming to third-year students, successfully securing placements for them in esteemed organizations such as HCL, Reliance, Barclays, and RBS. In collaboration with the Rotary Club of Chennai Premier, the Differently Abled Support Cell of our college conducted 'Dance Therapy' – a skill development training programme for special students. Knowledge-sharing sessions are conducted every Friday for a duration of two hours, covering topics such as Current Affairs, Indian Polity, Indian Economy, Aptitude, Mental Ability, and Logical Reasoning. These sessions are tailored to aid students in their preparation for the TNPSC Examination. In collaboration with the Vocational Rehabilitation Centre, the Differently Abled Support Cell has initiated a Six-month Computing Course for First year students, scheduled from 5th February 2026. In a collaborative initiative with RASA, students successfully performed the renowned drama 'Shakunthala,' focusing on inclusive performing arts at Naradha Ghana Sabha on 20th February 2026. Communication is the heartbeat of our community. Parent-Teacher Meetings are convened regularly to address concerns related to academics, co-curricular

engagements, and extra-curricular participation. Constructive feedback is provided, and remedial measures are implemented where necessary.

The College is a member of **Institution Innovation Council (IIC)**, an initiative by the Ministry of Education, Government of India to foster a culture of innovation, startups, and entrepreneurship within HEIs. Several Cells function with the objective of actualizing these measures by organizing periodic workshops/seminars/interaction with entrepreneurs, professionals and create mentor pool for student innovators.

The Training and Placement Cell of our college, coordinated by the faculty members, Ms. Preethika Rangasayee and Ms. Uma organized a structured series of training initiatives focusing on equipping students with essential employability skills, industry exposure, and career readiness.
