

## STUDENTS FEEDBACK SUMMARY: 2024-2025

A total of **1,120 students** participated in the feedback survey conducted during the academic year 2024 – 2025. The survey assessed key areas such as syllabus completion, teaching quality, internal assessment practices, learning and growth opportunities, extracurricular activities, skill development, infrastructure, library facilities, and overall ambience.

The responses indicate consistently **high levels of satisfaction**, with improvements observed in several areas compared to the previous academic year (2024–2025).

### 1. Syllabus Completion

- 98% of students reported that the syllabus is **always completed on time**.
- 2% mentioned that it is **completed on time most of the time**.

### 2. Teaching Quality

- 96% described their teachers' **approach to teaching as excellent**, while 4% rated it as **very good**.

### 3. Internal Test Discussions

- 96% of students strongly agreed that **their performance in internal tests was discussed regularly** with them.
- 4% stated teachers provide opportunities to discuss about their performance and provide feedback.

### 4. Opportunities for Learning and Personal Growth

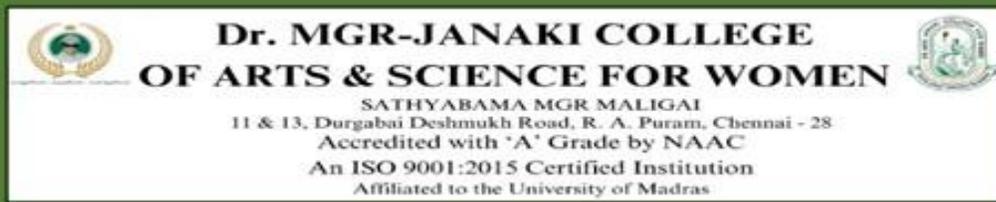
- 96% strongly agreed that the college provides **ample opportunities for both learning and personal development**.

- 93% strongly agreed that teachers **actively develop soft skills, life skills, and employability skills** among students.
- 6% agreed with this statement.



### 7. Infrastructure

- 93% strongly agreed that **classroom and laboratory infrastructure is satisfactory.**
- 7% agreed with this statement.

### 8. Library Facilities

- 90% strongly agreed that **recommended reference books and materials are available in the library.**
- 8% agreed with this statement.

### 9. Overall Ambience

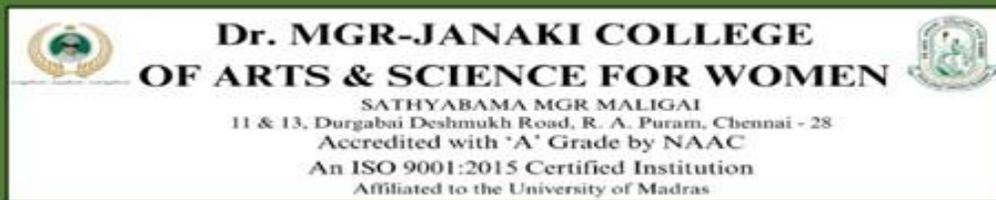
- 96% strongly agreed that the **overall ambience of the college is good and conducive to learning.**

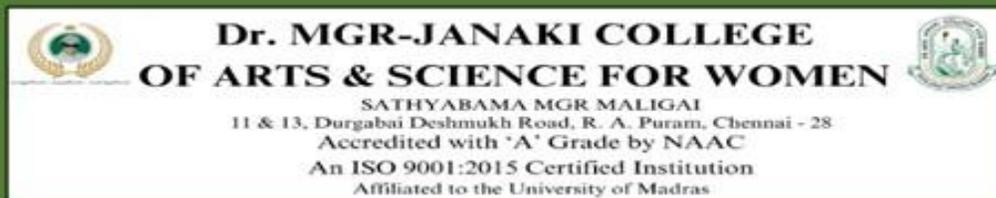

## **FACULTY FEEDBACK SUMMARY: 2024-2025**

The feedback from the faculty members regarding the overall functioning of the institution has been carefully analyzed. A majority of the faculty members have responded positively about the institution's performance. The analysis revealed the following key observations:

- The teachers acknowledged and appreciated the various initiatives undertaken by the college to support their professional growth and development.
- Most of the faculty members highlighted the active involvement of the management in promoting academic enrichment among staff. About **93%** of the faculty expressed a high level of satisfaction with the management's commitment to their welfare, while **7%** agreed with the statement. Overall, the analysis reflects a favorable picture of the welfare measures extended to the faculty by the management.
- It was observed that continuous monitoring of the curriculum quality is essential to serve the best interests of the students. Approximately **96%** of the faculty expressed satisfaction with the well-structured course outcomes and program outcomes of the syllabus. The course and program outcomes are clearly defined and designed to be student-centric, emphasizing the integration of knowledge and holistic development.
- Nearly **97%** of the faculty affirmed that the existing curriculum is holistic in nature, encompassing information, skills, attitudes, and values that students are expected to acquire, in line with the evolving demands of society.
- The college provides an environment conducive to the professional advancement of teachers. Around **97%** of the faculty agreed that the institution offers a setting favorable for teaching and research, while **3%** rated the teaching and research facilities as very good.
- The institution has effectively responded to concerns related to teaching-learning methodologies and aids that foster future learning and global competence—**93%** of respondents rated this aspect as excellent, **6%** as very good, and **1%** as good.
- Faculty members are given ample opportunities to explore innovative teaching approaches using ICT tools. A significant **95%** of the faculty expressed high satisfaction with the opportunities provided to learn and utilize ICT tools for effective conduct of online classes and assessments.
- A vast majority, **99%** of the faculty, expressed high satisfaction regarding the hygiene and cleanliness maintained on the campus, while **1%** rated it as very good. This indicates that the

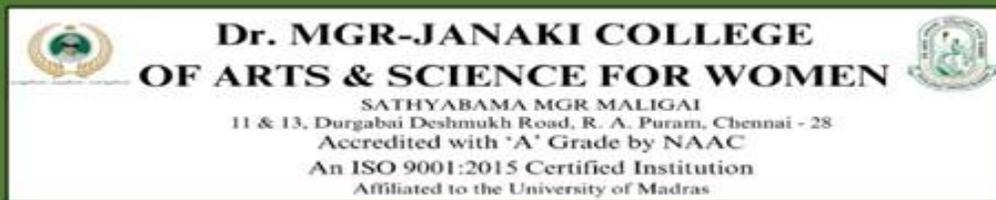


institution's efforts in ensuring a safe, secure, and pleasant work environment are highly valued and appreciated by the staff.

- Most of the faculty members (**98%**) confirmed that the college provides timely laboratory facilities required to enhance the learning process, with **2%** agreeing with the statement.
- Additionally, **99%** of the faculty members strongly agreed that the Faculty Development Programmes (FDPs) and other institutional initiatives for faculty development are effectively aimed at fostering strong ethical values and professionalism among the teaching community.

### Relevance of Units and Curriculum

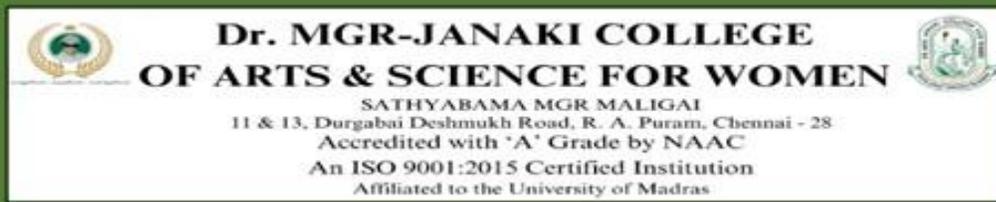
- **96%** of respondents stated that the units covered in each subject were **highly relevant** to their field of study.

The data clearly indicates that the curriculum not only imparts theoretical knowledge but also cultivates essential skills for career advancement.



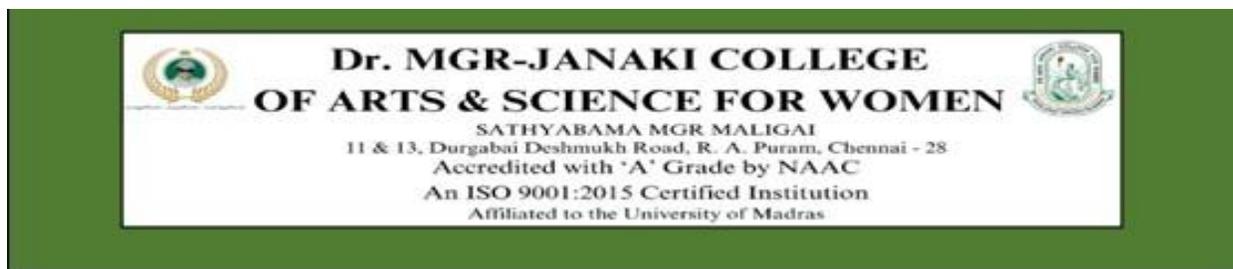
### Accessibility and Motivation

### Usefulness of Additional Programs

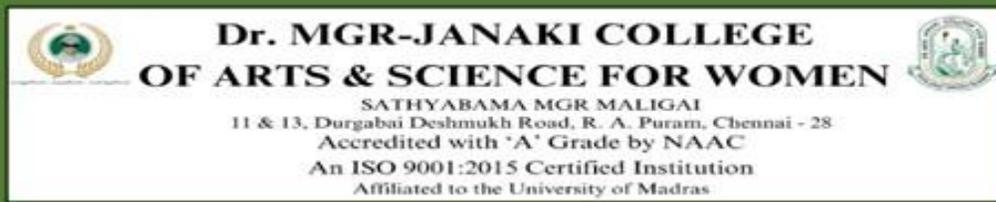
- **99%** of alumni acknowledged that the **certificate courses** offered by the college were **highly beneficial** in enhancing their skills and employability.

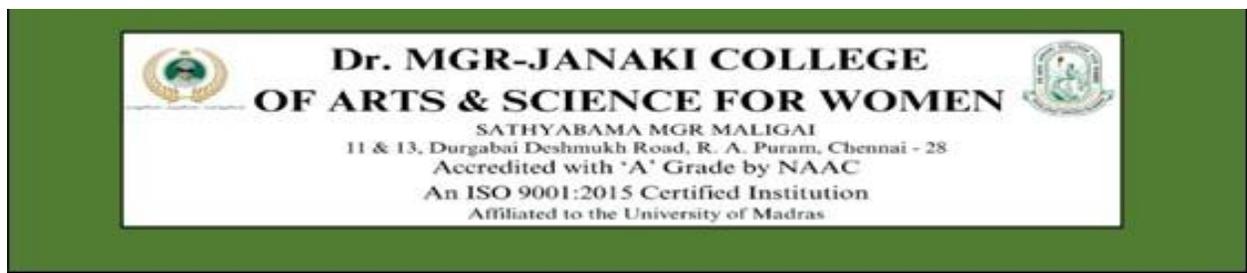
